Introduction

The documents in this volume are selected from the publication *Bronnen van de katholieke arbeidersbeweging in Nederland: toespraken, brieven en artikelen van Alphons Ariëns, 1887-1901 [Sources of the Catholic Labour Movement in The Netherlands: Speeches, Letters and Articles by Alfons Ariëns, 1887-1901]*.

At the head of every document, in the upper right of the page, is a reference to the location of the document, both in the source book mentioned above and in the Ariëns Collection preserved in the Catholic Documentation Centre in Nijmegen.

The codes have the following meaning:

BKAN= Sources Catholic Labour Movement in The Netherlands (followed by the document number in the book).

AA = Ariëns Archive (followed by a number)

BA = Ariëns Bibliography (followed by a number)
